Transparency & trust

-Labels

-Clear warranty

conditions

-Appropriate labelling

-Enhance value (tasks

performed on item)

-Define criteria -Refuse ineligible items -Minimize waste & costs

If non-reusable: maximize recycling -Might require dismantling /storage -Can generate income

-Cleaning -Grouping into batches -Small or extensive repairs

Care by handling -Wrapping -Secure with ropes -Store in boxes -Special tools for heavy objects

Build up a back up stock (useful to reconstitute incomplete sets,...)

-Customization

Good communication to attract donations
